AUSTRALIAN TAX INVOICE REQUIREMENTS

What information must they include?

Tax invoices for sales under \$1,000

Tax invoices for taxable sales of less than \$1,000 must include enough information to clearly determine the following seven details:

- 1. The words 'Tax invoice' preferably at the top
- 2. The identity of the seller/supplier, such as its' business name or trading name (contact details are optional, but recommended)
- 3. The supplier's Australian business number (ABN)*
- 4. The date invoice was issued
- 5. A list of the items sold, including quantity &price
- 6. The goods and services tax (GST) amount payable (if any). It should display the GST amount for each item separately, or, if the GST amount is exactly one-eleventh of the total price, it can use a statement such as 'Total price includes GST'
- 7. The extent to which each item sold includes GST. The invoice will meet this requirement if it either:
 - o shows the GST amount for each item OR
 - o clearly states that the total price includes GST

Examples:



Tax invoices for sales of \$1,000 or more

Tax invoices for sales of \$1,000 or more need to the 7 details as for under \$1000 & show the buyer's identity or ABN (usually the Club Leader who made the order)

If your tax invoices meet the requirements for sales of \$1,000 or more, you can also use them for sales of lesser amounts.

Example 2 shows:

- GST included in each line item
- the sale is clearly identified as being fully taxable by the words 'Total price includes GST'
- the buyer's identity for sales over \$1,000.



*WHAT IF YOUR AUSTRALIAN SUPPLIER DOES NOT HAVE AN ABN?
